Applicants are required to have completed either a Psy.D. or Ph.D. in clinical psychology from an APA-accredited program. Applicants are also required to successfully complete an APA-accredited clinical internship and have some prior coursework and/or clinical experience within the scope of integrated medicine, health psychology, and/or addiction.

ACG accepts up to four residents per training year. The ideal candidate:

- Has an interest in working with underserved communities, addiction, and culturally diverse populations
- Has a desire to engage in long-term psychotherapy work
- Is committed to pursuing a career in integrated medicine, HIV, LGBTQ health, and/or addiction

Describe any other required minimum criteria used to screen applicants:

While not an explicit focus of the residency, patients cared for at ACG tend to have experienced extensive trauma. We expect residents to have an interest in working with complex trauma and PTSD, and some prior experience working with individuals who have experienced psychological trauma.
